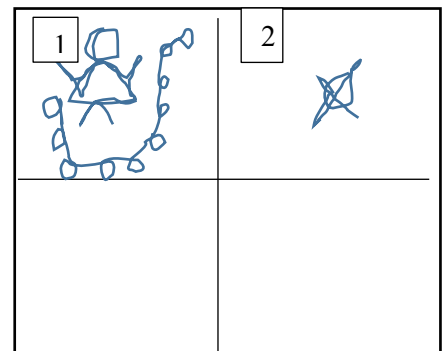

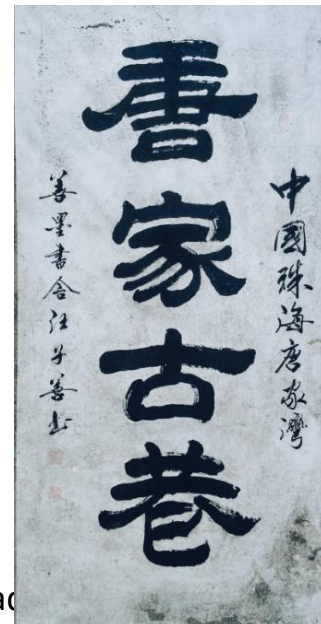

Godly: A Good Samaritan story. Helping a stranger.
- Story: Share the story behind the term 'The Good Samaritan' To understand how surprising this story is, Jewish people would have rated the Samaritan people as unholy
